Martin was recently informed that at least two people received an email purporting to be from him, which asked for the recipient




to 'discretely run an errand for him; reply by email if you're available'.



Heating and the boiler

As you will know, our old boiler broke down recently and you may be wondering what we are doing about this. We have, for a while, had a plan and funding set aside, to replace the old boiler.



The Church of England is keen to reduce the impact of our large buildings on the environment, so now requires us to seek faculty permission before installing a new gas boiler. This meant that we had to show that we have fully evaluated all the lower-carbon alternatives. This is very much in line with our own EcoChurch objectives, and we are well ahead in the process.

Our initial intention was to replace the current boiler with two new ones of comparable power but, after a comprehensive and detailed study by an independent heating consultant, we were advised that our current boiler was over-powered for the demand placed on it and that our replacement boilers should be smaller, so that they would operate nearer their maximum capacity and thereby be significantly more efficient. The updated plan for smaller boilers is less expensive in capital cost and will consume less gas. We were granted agreement in principle from the diocese to do this, but had not yet been granted the full faculty permission.

To repair the current boiler will cost over £3,500 in parts alone, and the parts were not available until the end of January anyway, so we have decided not to go ahead with any repairs but instead to implement the new plan immediately. We have applied for an emergency faculty to do this and work should start in a couple of weeks with completion by the end of February. We have the funds for this project.

Once completed we will have modern, efficient, reliable boilers that will be significantly cheaper to run and maintain. We will also be able to remove all the flue pipes in the flower vestry. We think it is well worth a few weeks of mild discomfort to get our heating problems properly sorted. I hope you agree. In the meantime, please do sit in the front few rows of chairs if you want to feel any benefit from the temporary heaters in church.
