

We hope to include music in the sessions!


On This Day' - 21st Sept.

We have been offered a painting done in about 1899 and shows St Michael's painted by Ralph Wright just before its demolition in 1899.


The restorer is keen to sell it, and has given us first refusal, and is open to offers if anyone would like to purchase it.
