As we approach Easter, we do so in the knowledge that Jesus defeated death and we can have resurrection hope. Life is renewed and



refreshed even in the most unlikely places, and this could hardly be more true than in our own churchyard. As part of our commitment to achieving the Eco-church Gold Award we have transformed a previously desolate area by the south-east door.

The photo shows Anthony Hulme harvesting some of the crops grown in one of the raised beds last summer; have a look at this bed and the 2nd full of sensory plants created by Chris Wellavize. This transformation of a bare, flagged piece of land is a dramatic example of how even a small, uninspiring area of land can be transformed for nature and people.

And don't forget the wild-flower beds established by Dek Kite and Lynne Spedding: more examples of how we are trying to increase the biodiversity of the churchyard.
