For Epiphany

Creator of the heavens, who led the Magi by a star to worship the Christ-child: guide and sustain us, that we may find our journey's end in Jesus Christ our Lord.

In December we remembered Jesus as Immanuel (#GodWithUs). Pray for those people, including any you know by name, who attended a church service during the Advent and Christmas seasons, praying that the God we worship in Jesus might reveal more of Himself and lead people in light, love, holiness and peace.

Our local schools:

Pray for all staff and pupils to return to school afresh from the Christmas break and with new commitment to teach, learn and work alongside one another in a spirit of friendship and support.

Also this month, the Governors of our church school, Bollinbrook C/E Primary, are seeking a new Head Teacher to start in September. Give thanks for: the good relationship between the church and the school; for Mike Waters (existing Head); and pray for love and patience for him and his staff team amidst an unsettling time. Pray too for God's leading in this crucial appointment for the church school.

For those in our world affected by conflict and recent tragedies:

Pray for areas of ongoing conflict – Syria, Iraq, Iran and others. Remember refugees fleeing these countries that they will find safety.

Pray for people who have lost homes and livelihoods through the wild fires in California, for the families of those who have died as a result of the flooding and mudslides in the Philippines, and for those suffering from the intercommunal violence in the Democratic Republic of Congo. Give thanks to God for the work of relief and humanitarian agencies, and ask God to bring light in times of darkness.

For our church leaders - Wardens, Church Council and Leadership Team:

Thank God for those people who serve our congregations, care for our building, and extend pastoral care within and beyond the church community; pray that everyone would work in ways where they sense God's delight in their offering.

Please pray especially for the new Leadership Team as it starts to work together.
